

dulcina hospice family update

July 22, 2020

Dear families,

We are grateful to let you know that we continue to do well at all our sites in keeping COVID-19 at bay.

Last Thursday, the Chief Medical Officer of Health released public health [Order 29-2020](#) pertaining to visitation in continuing care, supportive living, and hospice centres. The order allows for more options for you to visit your loved one. It also requires that we have a policy, processes, and plans in place to facilitate the visits. We are working hard on this and will be taking a phased approach to implementing the directives issued in the order to ensure the continued health and safety of your loved ones and our staff.

An important requirement of the order is assessing our collective risk tolerance. COVID-19 continues to be present; it has not gone away. Evidence indicates that seniors are among the most susceptible population to experience severe symptoms of COVID-19. Increasing the number of people in contact with residents also increases the potential for infection. We must keep these factors in mind as we work through the changes in visitation.

Effective July 23, 2020, as part of our first phase of implementing the new order, we will:

- Continue outdoor visits and increase the number of visitors to a maximum of five individuals, including the resident.
- Coordinate indoor visits, in the resident's suite, with the two designated family/support people plus one additional visitor, when the suite can accommodate this (note: you may be required to wear personal protective equipment at all times, depending on the number of people who are in a resident's room at one time).
- Invite you to bring food for your loved one in a container that can be wiped down with disinfectant.
- Ask you to either drop off gifts for your loved one to us for delivery or give them the gift during your visit.
- Continue to facilitate virtual visits if you prefer or cannot come in to the building.

As we prepare to launch this first phase we ask families to:

- Identify two people as the designated family/support individuals for your loved one's physical and mental wellbeing; these two individuals will be permitted to visit your loved one outdoors or indoors inside the resident's room.
- Continue to schedule visits with us ahead of time.
- Expect to be screened (temperature check and questionnaire) if you are entering the building.
- Participate in safe visitation education, that we will provide, prior to visiting.
- Wash your hands with soap and water before, during, and after your visit, or use hand sanitizer, as instructed.
- Wear a mask while inside the building. If visitors can and will maintain social distancing while in your loved one's room, the mask may be removed and discarded. A new mask will need to be on prior to exiting the room, using proper techniques, as instructed (i.e., wash hands before and after putting mask on, use only the elastics to put the mask on).
- Maintain a physical distance of six feet from one another (unless visitors are from the same household).

- Tell us if you have been exposed to COVID-19 in the 14 days prior to visiting and in the 14 days following your visit

The order indicates that visitors outside of the two designated family/support individuals are permitted in extenuating circumstances including when death is imminent, there is a change in health status (medical, social, spiritual crisis), and pressing circumstances (financial or legal matters, family crisis). These will be assessed on a case-by-case basis.

Co-responsibility is an important basis for the guidelines outlined in the new order. We must work together to minimize risk of infection for residents and staff. We continue to take all possible precautions including handwashing, screening, continuous masking, physical distancing, increased disinfecting, and more. Please carefully consider your potential exposure to COVID-19 before visiting; remember that we each bring every interaction we've had in the previous fourteen days into our next interaction.

As an organization and individual centres, a number of factors impact our risk tolerance that we must continuously assess including the total number of residents, staff, and visitors on site at any given time, the layout of our centres including how visitors enter the building and walk through common areas to enter their loved one's room, the collective health and wellbeing of residents, the number of residents who leave the centre for appointments, and the safety and health of our teams.

We have attached safe visitation and PPE information with this update to help you be more prepared. Please note that this does not replace the on-site safe visitation education you will receive each time you come into the centre.

It is imperative that visitors follow the stipulations to minimize risk of infection. We will address any concerns with you directly, should any arise.
