Dear families, residents, and staff,

We are grateful to let you know that all residents who have consented to receive the COVID-19 vaccine have received the first dose. The vaccine has brought with it, a sense of hopefulness amongst residents, their families, and staff. We, of course, must remain just as vigilant in following all public health protocols as we have these past many months to prevent continued transmission and outbreaks.

New guidelines for outdoor visits were released by the Chief Medical Officer of Health last week. Outdoor visits at our supportive living and continuing care centres are allowed for up to five people, including the resident. In addition, should a resident be well enough to leave the centre, they can be part of outdoor gatherings with up to nine others as long as all safety precautions are followed, including continuous masking, excellent hand hygiene, and physical distancing. Yesterday marked one year that the first person in Canada was diagnosed with COVID-19. This has been a startling year of implementing new processes and procedures and finding calm through the uncertainty. The year has certainly tested our collective resilience and faith.
